Student Learning Objectives (SLOs): Students will be able to;

- -identify the structure of an outline
- -create an outline for a paragraph

Warm-up (about 5 mins.)

First, show a picture of a building, then a building under construction and a construction drawing of a building. Ask students what they are and what the relationship among these pictures is. Finally, explain that writing a paragraph is similar to such kind of process, and draw their attention to a paragraph.

Presentation: (about 15 mins.)

- -Provide a sample paragraph to the students and ask them to find the topic sentence, major and minor ideas and the concluding sentence.
- -Show the outline of the paragraph mentioned above, and explain what an outline is and how it is organized.

Guided Practice: (about 30 mins. : 15 mins. for each activity)

- 1a. Provide 2 paragraphs and their outlines with missing parts to the students.
- 1b. Have students fill in each outline with the information from the related paragraph in pairs.
- 1c. Go over the answers with the class and provide feedback.
- 2a. Deliver a blank outline and a paragraph to the students.
- 2b. Have them fill in the outline with the information from the paragraph.
- 2c. Have students pair check their answers.
- 2d. Go over the answers with the whole class.

Independent Practice: (about 35 mins.)

- 1a. Provide 2 topics to the students. (Ex: summer holiday, favorite food/lesson etc.)
- 1b. Have students brainstorm about each topic and write down the ideas.
- 1c. Have them share their ideas and write them on the board.
- 1d. Ask students to create an outline for one of the topics in groups by using the ideas on the board. (If they wish, they can use extra ideas.)
- 1e. Have the groups share their outlines and provide a whole-class feedback.

Closure: (about 3 mins.)

Revise the lesson by asking students some questions like "What is outline?, Why do we use it?" and wrap up the lesson.

Assessment: (about 2 mins.)

Have students talk about their performances through the class and their understanding of the lesson.

Homework:

Assign homework to the students to write a paragraph by using the outlines they created in the class.

• I recommend you use paragraphs and outlines on Milestones of Writing, pages: 22-28 in any phase of the lesson, or you can use other sources.
