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TESOL Names Sarah Sahr as Association's First Head of Education and Events

Alexandria, Va. (Oct. 1, 2022) – TESOL International Association (TESOL) has named Sarah Sahr as the association's first-ever Head of Education and Events. Sahr previously served as TESOL's Director of Professional Learning & Research (2013–18) and as an education programs manager from 2010–13. She comes to the position from Amideast/Tunisia, where she was Director of English Language Programs.

In making the announcement, TESOL Executive Director Amber Crowell Kelleher said, "Sarah will lead our efforts to develop and execute a vision for next-generation growth and innovation for TESOL's portfolio of education, events, and publications—securing the association's role as the trusted global authority for knowledge and expertise in English language teaching."

Sahr holds a doctorate in education administration and policy from The George Washington University. Her research interests include online communities of practice/professional learning networks, teacher self-efficacy, combating teacher isolation, coteaching practices, and translanguaging. She has designed and presented English language professional learning opportunities in nearly two dozen global settings.

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In addition to her previous work with TESOL and Amideast/Tunisia, Sahr's career includes extensive experience as a teacher and administrator in various international settings, most notably as a Peace Corps Volunteer in Ethiopia, a traveling school teacher/administrator with Ringling Bros. and Barnum & Bailey circus, and an English language specialist with the U.S. Department of State. She is a certified ashtanga yoga instructor, an avid reader, and a novice runner. Currently, she resides in Tunisia with her husband and cat.
